Hajer George Stelmker was pilet of a 9-26 GS1 airplane 41-35068 on the afternoon of September 9, 1945. He was flying the lead ship of a formation on a lew altitude maneuver with TASCO.

While on a bombing run a land mine was exploded causing damage to above mention sirplame. In no way was the pilot responsible for the damage done to the sirplame.

The following damage was sustained by the airplane. The left propeller cuff was bent, left wing dented, deicer boot torn, small holes in fabric on left aileron, dents in left wing and left horizonal stabilizer, trailing edge of left elevator bent and torn, and two holes in left elevator.

The following information is submitted as per 3BC Memo 70-2-20 in connection with an accident which was accomplished by the 391st BOMB GROUP, 575th BOMB SQUAIRON:

1. PLACE, DATE AND TIME OF ACCIDENT:
Lebanon, Tennessee September 9, 1943 1600 CWT

2. AIRCRAFT STATION: Godman Field, Fort Knox, Kentucky

3. AIRCRAFT MODEL: B-26C21

4. PILOT (NAME AND RANK): GEORGE W. STALMAKER, Major

5. TOTAL PILOT HOURS: 426.7

6. HOURS ON THIS MODEL: 128.4

7. DATE OF CRIGINAL PILOT RATING: March 7, 1942.

8. CAUSE OF ACCIDENT: Explosion of land mine

9. Pilot's Statement:

I was pilot of a B-26021 airplane 41-35068 on the afternoon of September 9, 1943. I was flying the lead ship of a formation on a low altitude maneuver with TASOO.

At about 1600 CWT, I flew over the last target at a minimum altitude. Just before I reached the target a land mine was exploded in front of my plane throwing up a large quantity of dirt and rocks. I was unable to avoid the explosion and had to fly through it. The plane received a vielent shock and was thrown partially out of control.

When we passed through the column of dirt we found that there were holes in the nose plexiglass and that the gunner, S/Sgt Lloyd V. Alexander, 35330756 who had opened the bombay doors was severely bruised in the arm by a rock which had broken in. I could see dirt in the engines and dents in the cowling.

After landing I found that the left cowling was cracked, and the left elevator was ripped.

No injuries other than the above mentioned S/Sgt were sustained.

Demage to B-26021 Airplane serial no. 41-35068, occuring on 9 September 1943 when land mine was exploded beneath the airplane in flight is as follows:

Two ouffs on left propeller dented.

b. Dent in nose of left wing near fuselage. De-icer boot torn on left inboard wing.

Several small holes in fabric on left aileron.

- Several small dents on bottom of left wing. Several small dents on bottom of left horizontal stabilizer.
- Trailing edge strip on left elevator bent and torn in one
- Two holes through fabric in left elevator.

Airplane was out of commission two (2) days because of this damage.
